First Reading (Habakkuk 1:2-3. 2:2-4)

This is the only reading we have in the 3 year cycle of Sunday readings from the prophet Habakkuk, who prophesied about 600BC. In the first extract, the prophet complains about God's silence and apparent lack of concern in the face of the oppression and injustice suffered by his people. He pleads with God to remedy the situation. In the second extract, God responds. The prophet can rest assured that his pleas will not go unheeded. In God's own time matters will be sorted out.

Second Reading (1 Timothy 1:6-8. 13-14)

This is a beautiful passage attributed to Paul in which he encourages Timothy on whom he had imposed his ordaining hands. He tells Timothy that he must never be ashamed of witnessing to the Lord, that he must accept the sufferings involved in preaching the gospel.

Gospel Reading (Luke 17:5-10)

These two texts come at the end of a collection of passages, often unrelated in meaning, many occurring only in Luke's Gospel. In the first the apostles ask Jesus to increase their faith. Jesus informs them that it is not the quantity of faith that is important: what matters is the quality of faith. The second text takes the form of a parable. When a slave returns from a day's work in the fields, he has no right to expect special treatment for what he has done since he belongs to his master. Likewise, the apostles are servants and if they accomplish great things, it is only because the Lord has given them the power to do so. They have no claim on him and they can never suppose that he is indebted to them because what they accomplish, they accomplish through the power that he has that he has given them.

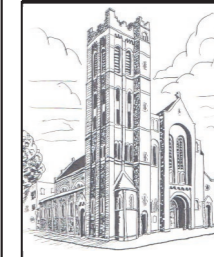
